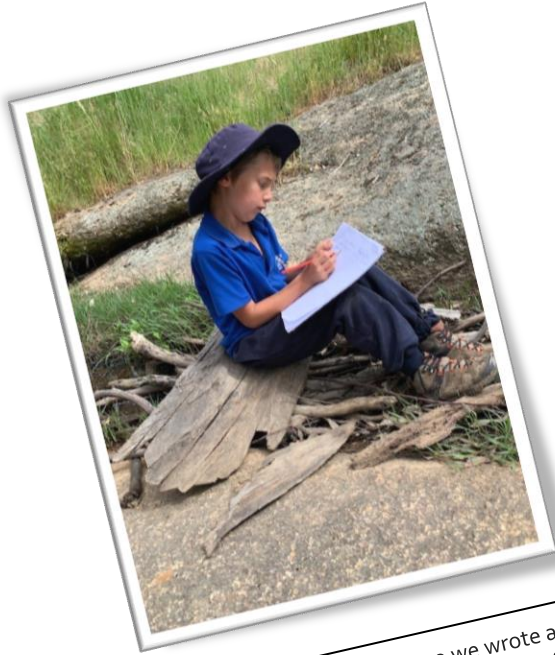

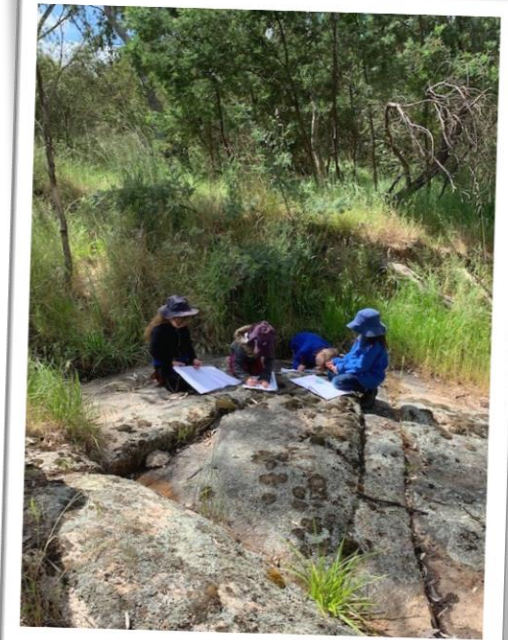
Ollie: Today was outdoor classroom day so we wrote a story about what we can see and feel all around you. I felt the breeze on my skin and it felt nice.
