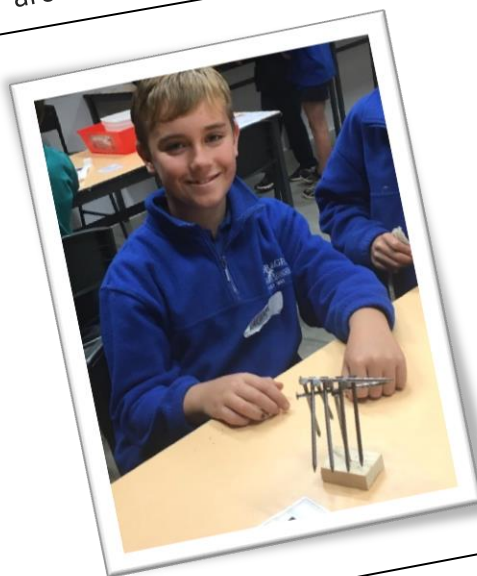
Logan: Today we went to Beechworth Secondary College for transition day. We got to do sport and music. I was playing the drums. I enjoyed today

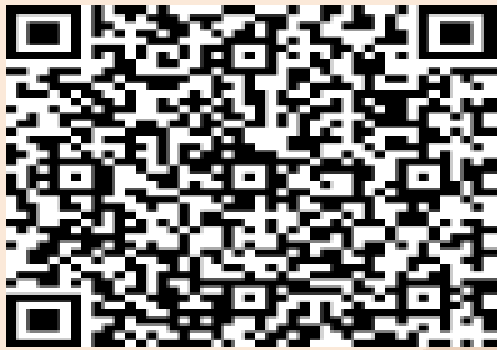
