National Day of Action against Bullying & Violence: Tomorrow we will acknowledge the National Day of Action against bullying and Violence. We spoke about this in our whole school social and emotional learning session on Wednesday and looked at defining what these words meant. We also spoke about the ways we liked to be treated and aligned these with why we have our school values. Students are welcome to wear an orange accessory tomorrow to acknowledge the day. Our hope is that all of our students know what it is to feel safe and protected and that they are aware of the appropriate ways that they should be treated and treat others.

Orphan Lambs: We are very fortunate here at Wooragee to have our Orphan Lamb program. Each year, when Lucas Mills has Orphan Lambs, we get to take care of them, bottle feed them, look after them, etc, until they are weaned, where we then go and watch them be shorn at the sheds. We get to apply real-life learning in Maths, Science, English and the experience is rich in many ways. We have also been blessed over the years as our resident farmer (Megan) has always taken the Lambs overnight and on weekends until they are strong enough to stay in the paddock on their own. With Megan away on maternity leave, we are in a predicament. We are looking for families who would be able and willing to share in the care of the lambs during the month or so that we would need to have them fed at night and taken home. I am able to take them on weekends, but my hours throughout the week would not allow me to do it. If you think you might be able to help us, please let me know. I suspect we will have lambs by the end of the month.

Cow Poo Lotto: Claudia has very kindly started organising the Cow Poo Lotto for this years Easter Market. Beechworth Wildlife Stays have very generously donated a night's accommodation for the prize, which is just incredible. We are very appreciative. 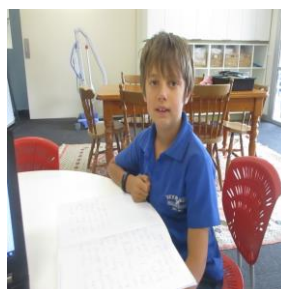
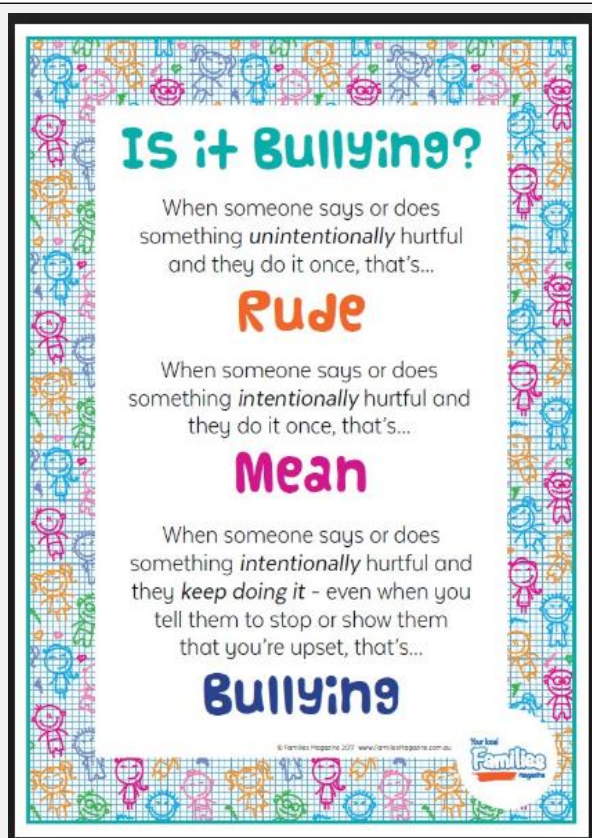
