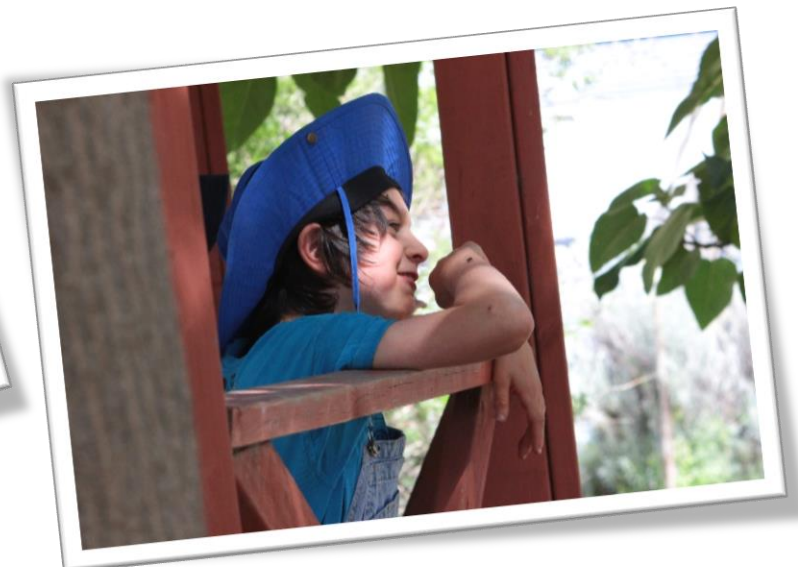
Xaine: Yesterday Nikita my sister was here for transition Day. She was burying me in the chip bark on the playground.
