Mental Health and Wellbeing at Wooragee PS

Hi families!

I'm Erin, this is my fifth year at Wooragee PS. Prior to going on maternity leave last year, I worked in a classroom teaching role. Since returning I am working two days a week in the Mental Health and Wellbeing role. I wanted to share a bit about my role and the different ways I can support your children.

This program came out of Victoria's Royal Commission into mental health and most Victorian primary schools now have a person allocated to this role. The role is not that of a school counsellor, but rather to build classroom teachers' capacity to support student mental health and help to create care pathways for families to access local support services. I am mostly working to promote positive mental health and minimise the need for further interventions. Some things I have worked on recently are:

- -Attending Calmer Classrooms professional development (with Grace) to present to our staff
- -Working with the wellbeing team to develop lessons for our Social and Emotional Learning curriculum
- -Collecting mental health data of senior students to develop our school capacity to cater to more specific needs in our school community
- -Teaching weekly social skills lessons to a class group
- -Working with individual students to support them with emotional regulation strategies, developing friendships and school refusal. My work days are Thursday and Friday, if you think I could support your child, please email erin.robbins@education.vic.gov.au

Our Commitment to Being a Child Safe School

At our school, the safety and wellbeing of every child is our highest priority. We are committed to providing a learning environment where all students feel safe, supported, and respected.

As part of the Victorian Child Safe Standards, we follow clear policies and practices designed to protect children from harm and ensure their voices are heard. These standards guide us to:

- Promote student empowerment giving children the confidence to speak up and be active participants in decisions that affect them.
- Create a culturally safe environment where the identity and wellbeing of Aboriginal children and children from all cultural backgrounds are respected.
- Engage families and the community working together with parents, carers, and the wider community to build a strong culture of child safety.
- Ensure staff suitability and training all staff and volunteers are carefully screened and receive ongoing training in child safety, wellbeing, and responding to concerns.
- Maintain safe environments both physical and online, where risks are identified and managed responsibly.

We regularly review our policies, Code of Conduct, and risk management practices to make sure they meet current requirements and reflect our strong commitment to child safety.

We encourage parents and carers to be partners in this work. If you have any questions, concerns, or suggestions about child safety at our school, please contact the school principal or speak with your child's classroom teacher.

Together, we can make sure our school remains a place where every child feels safe, valued, and able to thrive.


